A story to tell...

We all have a story, each one of us unique, although there often many threads of life we share. This is a piece of Jesse's story, a life that was changed because of the generous gifts from our community

Jesse has been clean and sober for more than one year. He works full time at Streets Alive Mission. He is truly a blessing to others.

Jesse is one of the most kind people, he is always thinking of and doing for others. My story so far... I was born in Calgary. I was about 13 years old when my parents got divorced, I moved to Kelowna for a few years, and then to Port Hardy for a few years. I just kept getting passed back and forth between my parents. At 16 I went out on my own.

I've always been around drugs and alcohol; it was just something that was always there. I started drinking heavy when I was 13. I was doing heavier drugs by the time I was 20. I always classified myself as a functional alcoholic because I always worked hard, I worked in the oil patch for 12 years and lots of other jobs when the rigs were shut down. I owned my own house when I was 23, I had a wife and kids in my life, I was a good dad. I was a good person – but I was a drug addict.

With the addiction, my life spiraled. My family saw me as a failure, I was the black sheep. The following years were foggy, I used drugs and alcohol for many years. I was in and out of jail, I was on the streets, I have seen so many people overdose. I have seen so many dead – so many. When in the addiction I experienced horrific acts of violence towards myself and others. I got caught up in all the wrong things. I ran drugs for many years until I got caught. I tried to commit suicide many times and others tried to kill me too. I have been kidnapped, been stabbed multiple times and I never died. I always knew that God had a purpose for me. I had finally had enough and decided I needed to change my life. I was tired of being forgotten, alone, feeling like I was good for nothing a waste of time.

I came to Streets Alive Mission, Exodus Men's Life Recovery Program - I fit in here. My whole life has switched for the better. I quit everything. I don't smoke cigarettes. I don't take pills. I don't do drugs. I don't drink. I'm back in touch with my kids. I talked to my mother and father and brothers. I enjoy my life. My life is worth a lot more than I used to think it was, and it's been changed ever since I'm a different person. Well, same person, just different choices now.

Streets Alive Mission Life Recovery Programs bring hope to people like Jesse, and change lives.

"I have nothing to hide. It's nothing I'm shameful for. It was the way my life was meant. My name is Jesse Tabor,

that's who I am."
