"It was a cold night in January, the shelter was full and there was nowhere to go.
There were a bunch of us huddled up in groups at the library, it was a particularly bad day. It was about 2 o'clock in the morning and we saw the Streets Alive vehicle pull up. Tears came to my eyes; my first thought was we were not forgotten.
The Outreach team got out and gave us handwarmers and mittens and a cup of hot chocolate. This changed everything, for many of us that are out here on the streets, we mattered. The outreach team treats us like human beings, bring hope and makes a difference." - Sarah

What Do We Leave Behind?

Have you ever thought about it? I know I have. Who is going to remember me when I'm not kicking around the planet anymore, dazzling those around me with my sardonic wit and ohso-funny jokes? What kind of impact have I had, if any? Will I be remembered fondly? Or will it be more of an Ebenezer Scrooge



scenario, with a group of folks chatting about my death and chortling, only offering to attend my funeral if lunch is provided?

Streets Alive began in a very small, humble way. When it was clear that the people we were bussing to church services were uncomfortable there, we started our own service in the bus depot and fed them a simple meal of sandwiches afterwards. But the impact of those humble beginnings are felt today. Pastors Ken and Julie Kissick have seen this ministry through seven different main locations to where we are now. We've had programs come and go, depending on the need that we've seen and felt God wanted us to fill in the community. They set a course and sailed Streets Alive though some, at times, very choppy waters.

They also raised three children while doing this, and those children have given them four grandchildren. Their home has always been a place where people felt welcome and safe, even if they left covered in dog hair (love them, love their dogs!). Pastor Ken was diagnosed with cancer in 2002, which was also the same year the walk-in/shelter was closed down. Those were some choppy waters. Nevertheless, they persisted. They reopened in a different location and Pastor Ken has been cancer free for over twenty years. Streets Alive Mission has continued to grow, both up as well as out.

Streets Alive Mission runs a variety of programs overseen not only by Pastors Ken and Julie, but by the officers that they've trained to come beneath and beside them. There's an entire team that shares the passion and the enthusiasm for the people that Pastors Ken and Julie have always had, the kind that has kept them in the ministry for more than 30 years and will continue this ministry for the next 30 years.

Now that's a legacy!

Looking Back and Moving Forward

This year we have expanded our Outreach Street Team to operate 24 hours a day, across all of Lethbridge. The need for this service is real!

In January 2023 alone, our team had 5,533 interactions with individuals, attended 222 encampments, gave out 494 referrals, provided 32 transports to shelter or emergency and prevented 8 overdoses! We were also able to transport 8 people to detox.

Streets Alive Mission is planning to raise an estimated \$1,500,000 this year on fundraising campaigns. It will cost the organization an estimated \$149,000. The money raised will be used to provide services for those struggling with poverty in our community.
