Poverty is real in Lethbridge

Poverty is not a "topic". It is *real* people in *real* trouble. Yes! There is poverty in Lethbridge, and it is affecting people you know, right here, right now.

People are choosing between paying rent and buying lunch for their kids because they can't do both.

People are couch surfing, sleeping "rough" out in the elements, or worse, because they can't afford a room of their own for even one night.

People walk kilometre after kilometre, everywhere they go, through wind and rain and snow, because they cannot afford bus fare.

These aren't just any people. These are OUR people – Lethbridge People!

There is a face (and a name, and a story) for every person served at Streets Alive Mission. These faces matter!





Feedin' Them Hope

Streets Alive Mission offers a safe and welcoming location for individuals to come in to get warm or cool down, have refreshments, or a change of clothes. It's a place where they are treated with dignity and respect, and can build relationships. It's



a much needed sanctuary to briefly escape life on the streets and have hope fed into their life. With no appointments required, anyone in need of support can access the Streets Alive Mission for support, resources and referrals.

In December, 2022 Streets Alive Mission opened a "warming centre", at the request of the City. In this time we saw on average 80 individuals per day that would have frozen had they not had a warm place to be. The need for the "warming centre" was due to the shortage of space at the shelter. Although we faced many challenges, Streets Alive Mission stepped up to help save lives.

P.I.N. Bank

The P.I.N. Bank (which stands for People In Need), not only supplies clothing to people in need, it also provides another tool where we can get to know people, and build relationships.

The PIN Bank is the workhorse of the Mission and gives our clients a much needed sanctuary to briefly escape life on the streets. Here, they have the opportunity to relax and find clothes that not only will suit their needs, but their personality, as well.

The PIN Bank sees an average of 50 people per day utilizing this service, with more than 500 unique clients.

Takin' It To The Streets

The Streets Alive Mission Outreach Team provides nourishment to the mind, body and soul for individuals on the street. They also assist in cleaning up our community to keep it beautiful. Our outreach team takes to the streets in the areas of our city where they are most needed. They adjust the work they do based on the season, and the community needs.

The Streets Alive Mission Outreach Team has assisted the City with encampment response, ensuring those in need, have their basic needs met. We even staffed two City buses that brought refuge to those in the cold in February and March of 2023.

This team also provides housing referrals and transportation to detox/treatment facilities, and non-emergent rides to medical care. In January 2023, the team assisted 13 individuals in getting into treatment programs, as of June 2023, eleven of those individuals were still sober.



People who have no fixed address often suffer from a condition called "Street Feet", which is painful and unhealthy. **Foot Fridays at Streets Alive** is a program where volunteers offer foot care – warm foot soak, trimmed nails, treatment of mild foot ailments, plus a pair of clean socks and good shoes.

Nearly every Friday evening we have volunteers who help care for tired, sore feet in need of some TLC.

A warm foot wash, nail care, and some fresh socks makes a huge difference in foot health.

Even the regional health care system has noticed how Foot Friday has reduced the foot problems seen by emergency and clinic staff!

Foot Fridays sees a number of regular clients, including people who are unhoused, seniors and those accessing mental health services.





Trusteeship Program

We help people grow in their financial stability by serving as their Financial Guardian.

The Trusteeship Program grows client's dignity by enabling them to find financial stability, which helps to move them gradually out of poverty and into a place where they can maintain their own financial future.

All client's funds are deposited in a trust account with Streets Alive Mission. Each individual works with our trustee officer to develop a budget to ensure that their funds sustain them throughout the month. This budget ensures that critical expenses are looked after (rent, telephone, utilities) to protect the client and keep them safe.

The financial counselling clients receive will help them develop the skills necessary to manage their finances independently. This is mandatory for all residents of Streets Alive Mission's supportive housing facilities.

Streets Alive Mission has between 120 and 150 Trusteeship clients.



The Care Cuts Salon is a program that helps to restore dignity to those in need. This is a salon where our clients can not only get their hair washed and cut by professional volunteer stylists, but they also receive much needed contact, care, and the knowledge that they are worthy of such treatment.

We are so grateful for the many volunteers that gift their time to our Restoration of Dignity programming. These volunteers are willing to go beyond societal stigmas and provide service to those in our community who are often forgotten or ignored. The impact these programs have on people is imeasurable.









Streets Alive Mission's RePurpose Donation Centre provides clothing and household items to those in need, at no cost. Streets Alive accepts donations from the community, sorts through all items and distributes them. We also provide community pick ups for those unable to bring their donations in, and work collaboratively with several community organizations.

Our RePurpose Donation Centre assists more than 20 families per week.

Our food bank shares this location and provides food hampers for those that need a little help making ends meet. We distribute approx. 50 individual food hampers and 20 family food hampers weekly. RePurpose Donation Centre

safe, faith-based recovery for women

Genesis Women's Life Recovery Program is a multi-tiered program that assists vulnerable women who want to recover their lives.

Streets Alive Mission operates **Genesis Connect for Women**, a facility offering programming specifically designed to help women reconnect emotionally and spiritually. We also offer a supervised residency program.

Key programming is Christ-centered and includes emotional counselling and post-addiction support.

The Genesis program has seen some women move on to postsecondary education, jobs and families and go on to happy, healthy, productive lives, still under the guidance of the Genesis support team.



In 2022, we supported 33 women who achieved 120 days sobriety and recovered their lives.







Exodus Men's Recovery Program is about leaving the past behind and finding new healthy relationships with family, peers, mentors, and, most importantly, with God. Our Exodus program is a faith-centered, abstinence-based program which walks with men through the process to change their lives. Programming concentrates on group therapy, accessing counselling, work skills, literacy upgrading, and financial stability. *It is designed to heal the brokenness of their lives.*

Libertas (Parkside) Home is a secure men's home which offers a caring and affordable Christian environment designed to change the direction of men's lives. Through our program of counselling and accountability, our Parkside Home helps men overcome the life issues that have hindered them from achieving their destiny. By providing a safe and secure living environment, the men can work through the life issues that have previously seemed undefeatable.

The Exodus Men's Life Recovery Program has implemented a Rapid Relapse Response Pilot Project. In the first 3 months of this project, 14 men were able to continue of their recovery journey and stay sober.

In 2022, 77 men reclaimed their lives and celebrated 120 days of sobriety. This program sees more than 30 applications per month.
